Mt. Hebron United Methodist Church History Fact
 The small white building located on the Hebron Dr. side of the church, is known as the Temperance Hall. Built in 1862, it is the only one in S.C. & possibly the oldest in the nation. It was renovated in the 1940's & used as a classroom for the Men's Bible Class. After a restoration in 1982, it was placed on the National Register of Historical Places, & and a historical marker was erected.
